

Monterey Car Week Roars Back August 8-17 with Stellar Automotive Events, Community Engagement and Global Attention

Monterey County welcomes visitors for the world's premier celebration spanning the full spectrum of car culture

Monterey, Calif., August 5, 2025 - Monterey Car Week, the world-renowned celebration of automotive excellence set against California's stunning Central Coast, returns August 8-17, 2025, with more than 35 car-centric events across the County. From marquee moments like the Pebble Beach Concours d'Elegance and The Quail, A Motorsports Gathering, to new and expanded events like Woodies in the Woods and Motorlux's Michelin-star culinary showcases, Monterey Car Week continues to bring new energy, refreshed events and deeper community connection.

New and noteworthy in 2025

- <u>Woodies in the Woods</u> debuts at Asilomar Conference Grounds, celebrating the classic woodpaneled wagons with live music, food and a custom craft lager by <u>Other Brother Beer Co</u>.
- <u>The Paddock Monterey</u> joins the lineup with a 50-car RADwood showcase of '80s and '90s automotive lifestyle, celebrating the 25th anniversary of the Saleen S7.
- Motorlux levels up with more food and beverage activations than ever before, spotlighting local talent including the region's James Beard and Michelin-starred chefs.
- <u>Rolex Monterey Motorsports Reunion</u> celebrates the 75th Anniversary of Formula One and the debut of NASCAR legends racing in their original IROC cars for the first time ever at <u>WeatherTech Raceway Laguna Seca</u>.
- <u>Pebble Beach Concours d'Elegance</u> makes history once again as it presents all eight generations
 of the Rolls Royce Phantom together for the first time in North America. Phantoms I through VI
 will grace the 18th fairway, while Phantoms VII and VIII take center stage at Concours Village.
- Exotics on Broadway broadens with a five-block enclosed hypercar and vendor village, featuring 40+ exclusive hypercars and VIP lounge.
- <u>Prancing Ponies Women's Car Show</u> an event dedicated to creating opportunities for lowincome women expands its pawprint with adoptable pets on-site at its Carmel-by-the-Sea soiree.

Visitors can also enjoy more than 20 free events countywide, from quirky fun at <u>Concours d'Lemons</u> to parading classics at <u>Pebble Beach Tour d'Elegance</u> and <u>Pacific Grove Rotary Concours Auto Rally</u>. "Monterey Car Week is more than just horsepower and heritage, it's a catalyst for economic vitality and community prosperity," said Rob O'Keefe, president and CEO of See Monterey. "The event is an engine in the local tourism economy and delivers an unmatched global spotlight on our destination."

The celebration draws over 100,000 visitors to Monterey County each year, with estimated visitor spending of over \$130 million. With hotel demand growing year over year, Monterey Car Week accounts for over 5% of the region's total annual hotel room nights in just 10 days. Last year's auctions broke multiple world records across various models, including the Ferrari F50 going for \$5.5 million at the RM Sotheby's auction.

While Monterey Car Week and the Pebble Beach Concours d'Elegance are some of the region's most impactful events in global significance, their philanthropic reach is equally significant. More than 100 local charities benefit from event proceeds, including youth programs, education funds and community foundations throughout Monterey County.

"These events generate income for our community and substantial donations for local charities," said Sandra Button, chairman of the Pebble Beach Concours d'Elegance. "I'm proud to note that the Pebble Beach Concours raised a record \$3.1 million for charity this past year, and we're on track to match or surpass that in 2025, bringing our total charitable contributions to over \$45 million."
